Who are Clinical Pharmacists?

Clinical Pharmacists are experts in medicines. We provide face to face and telephone structured medication reviews, long term condition clinics such as asthma, type 2 diabetes and high blood pressure (hypertension). We also offer post hospital discharge reviews, and are on hand in the surgery to help with prescription queries and medication queries from patients and clinicians.

Some Clinical Pharmacists are also prescribers in a particular long term condition, which means we can support patients to manage their condition, and change medications/dosages as appropriate.



Qualifications

Clinical Pharmacists have completed a four year Master's degree in Pharmacy, followed by a pre-registration training year in either hospital or community pharmacy.

In order to work in GP practice, Clinical Pharmacists will be enrolled onto an 18-month NHS England approved training pathway, which is followed by a 6-9 month university based Independent prescribing course.
